



COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES

HEATHER'S HOPE: A CENTER FOR VICTIM'S OF CRIME

The Lincoln Center for Family and Youth (TLC) provides free counseling services to individuals affected by crime, funded by the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) through the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD). Heather's Hope: A Center for Victims of Crime offers a wide range of support, including mobile counseling, case management, and art therapy services for individuals of all ages.

CHILDREN & YOUTH SERVICES

TLC's Children and Youth Services partners with the Montgomery County Office of Children and Youth (OCY) to provide vital services to individuals and families in need. Our services include case management, drug and alcohol counseling, family strengthening programs, and specialized support for homemaker and hoarding challenges.

VIOLENCE INTERVENTION & PREVENTION

In partnership with Trinity Health Mid-Atlantic, TLC's Violence Intervention and Prevention Program (VIPP) provides hospital-based crisis intervention, trauma-informed therapy, and case management to address immediate needs and break the cycle of violence through long-term support.

BOB SCHILLER

LIFE JOURNEY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD



Bob Schiller (1950-2005) was a visionary leader who dedicated his life to empowering non-traditional students through education, guidance, and support. At just 25 years old, he pursued his dream of creating a school for students who needed additional academic, social, emotional, and mental health support.

In 1975, Bob secured a grant to establish an alternative school, laying the foundation for what would become The Lincoln Center for Family and Youth (TLC). As the first principal of the school and later the founding Board President of TLC, Bob's passion and dedication shaped the organization's mission and impact. His leadership helped TLC grow into a trusted leader in serving children and families.

In honor of his lasting legacy, the Bob Schiller Life Journey Scholarship was established. This scholarship is awarded annually to a graduating Academy senior who exemplifies resilience, determination, and a commitment to personal growth—qualities that Bob championed throughout his life.

Through this scholarship, Bob's spirit of empowerment and belief in the potential of every student lives on, inspiring future generations to continue their own life's journey with purpose and perseverance.
